Truly an outstanding contributor to the community for many years, Earl B. Loggins was granted numerous prestigious awards from civic organizations for his outstanding work, including the Joseph C. Valley Community Advocate Award in 2005. A native Houstonian, Earl Loggins graduated from Booker T. Washington High School and attended the University of Houston. Except for serving in the US Army during World War II and attending Cornell University in New York, he's given his time and effort to the city he loves, Houston.

Before retirement, "Big Earl", as he was fondly called, also worked as a personal consultant to the Texas Eastern Transmission Corporation. He was a Vice President of Saint Elizabeth Hospital, served on the Board of Directors, UNCF, was a Chairman, United Fund, Advisor to EEOC, and Board Director, YMCA, for which he was also an active fund raiser.

He served with the Commission for Harris County Grand Jury and for five years served as Vice Chairman of the Civil Service Commission under Mayors Jim McCann and Kathy Whitmire. He also served on the Grievance Committee for the State Bar of Texas. Always interested in providing quality education to African American youth, Mr. Loggins also served as Treasurer of the Houston Community College System Foundation.
